ORDER FOR TEMPORARY INJUNCTION

Now before the Court is the Motion and Complaint of the Plaintiff praying for the immediate issuance of a temporary injunction enjoining the Defendant, 21st Century Legal Services, Inc., from engaging in any mortgage loan activity, including, but not limited to, mortgage loan modification activity, in this state or to residents in this state, and the Court being well advised as to all matters of law and fact arising herein, finds:


1. This Court has jurisdiction and venue over the parties and the subject matter involved herein.
2. This Court has the authority to issue a temporary restraining order in this case pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 23-39-514(l) and A.R.C.P. Rule 65.
3. Based upon the allegations and information contained in the Complaint, the statements set forth in the Affidavit of A. Heath Abshure, and additional exhibits attached to the Complaint, it appears that the Defendants have solicited, offered, or engaged in mortgage loan activity with Arkansas residents in violation of Arkansas Code Annotated §§ 23-39-503(b), 23-39-503 (c) and 23-39-514(d).

4. It appears that residents of the State of Arkansas may be irreparably harmed by the activities of the Defendants if the temporary injunction is not immediately issued.

5. The harm to the members of the public, in whose place the Plaintiff stands, is irreparable and far outweighs the harm that could be done the Defendant by the issuance of this temporary injunction.

6. It is likely that the Plaintiff will succeed on the merits of this case and that a permanent injunction will be entered.
